Are you up for saving lives?

- ◆ Students Donating for Life is a contest designed for high schoolers to have fun while learning the importance of donating blood.
- ◆ Schools may schedule as many blood drives as they desire between August 1, 2010 and July 31, 2011.
- ◆ Anyone who is 16 years old weighing 120 pounds (with parental consent form), or at least 17 years old weighing 110 pounds, and in good general health can donate blood.
- ◆ Friends and family members are invited to participate.
- ◆ Schools must conduct 2 or more blood drives to qualify (2-day drives count as one blood drive).

Prizes and How to Win

\$1000 per division gift certificate* Highest percentage of blood donations in each division
(Based on number of juniors & seniors)

\$1000 gift certificate* School with the highest total number of donors in each division

Drawing for \$1000 gift certificate* Schools that host 4 or more blood drives

Schools are eligible to win both categories in their division.

* Gift certificates are nonrefundable, nontransferable, no cash value

All high school seniors are eligible to participate in the South Texas Blood & Tissue Center Red Cord Honors Program. It was designed specifically to acknowledge and honor the students who are making such significant contributions to our community. Each senior who has given blood six times during their lifetime are eligible to receive a red cord and pin.
